NOTES FOR APPLICANTS

- 1 A small number of bursaries will be available for graduates (or holders of equivalent qualifications) who are either starting a course for a second first degree or who are already attending such a course.
- 2 The purpose of the bursaries is to assist candidates to change direction in their studies. The main subject(s) of the second first degree course must therefore be different from those of the first qualification. Candidates should normally already possess a degree, but holders of other qualifications will also be considered: the qualification already held should be one which makes candidates ineligible for a grant from the Student Awards Agency for Scotland, Local Education Authorities or other funding bodies for all or part of their second first degree course. The bursaries are not available for postgraduate courses.
- 3 The amount of funds available is limited, and it is unlikely that individual candidates will receive more than a small contribution towards their support. The amount awarded to individual candidates in any year will depend on the number of strong cases in that year. Candidates may be supported for more than one year, but must re-apply annually.
- 4 Application must be made on the appropriate form, obtainable from the Clerk to the Faculties of Science, Boyd Orr Building, University of Glasgow, Glasgow, G12 8QQ. Completed forms should be returned to the Clerk by 25th August 2008 if possible, but later applications may be considered where candidates were not in a position to apply earlier. The forms must be completed in **black ink** or typescript. Any additional information which the candidate considers relevant may be given on a separate sheet and attached to the form.
- 5 Candidates should also investigate other possible sources of financial support. Many educational trusts are local in character, and eligibility often depends on factors such as the candidates' residential qualifications. Candidates may find it useful to consult "The Directory of Grant Making Trusts" (published by the Charities Aid Foundation), "The Grants Register" (published by McMillan Press) and the "Charities Digest" (published by the Education Grants Advisory Service). These publications should normally be available for inspection at public reference libraries.

Scottish students may wish to note that the SAAS maintains a Register of Educational Endowments, which contains information on known Scottish trusts. If students wish the Register to be searched on their behalf, they should complete and return an enquiry form obtainable from the Student Awards Agency for Scotland, Gyleview House, 3 Redheughs Rigg, South Gyle, Edinburgh, EH12 9YT.
